He is the recipient of the Masayoshi Ohira Memorial prize, the *Chunichi Shimbun* Special Achievement Award, the distinguished Japan Foundation Award, and the Order of the Rising Sun Gold and Silver Star by the Emperor of Japan. He wrote numerous books including *Seiji to Sanma-Nihonto Kurashite 45 nen* (Politics and Saury: 45 Years Living with Japan), *The Japanese Way of Politics*, and *Nihon No Seiji O Doo Miru Ka*.
